I have been advised and understand that in connection with the above-entitled case, I am being granted formal probation, or that my sentence includes a split-sentence with mandatory supervision by the Inyo County Probation Department.

I understand that California Penal Code § 1203.35 provides for possible "flash incarcerations" of up to ten (10) consecutive days in jail for each alleged violation of the terms and conditions of my probation or mandatory supervision, if at the time of granting probation or ordering mandatory supervision, the court obtains my "...waiver to a court hearing prior to the imposition of a period of flash incarceration." I understand that I cannot be denied probation based on my refusal to waive my rights and agree to "flash incarcerations."

I understand that even though I am signing this waiver and agreement, I still have the right to refuse to accept any flash incarceration recommended by the Probation Officer, and exercise my due process rights; including, but not necessarily limited to, notice of the alleged violation(s) by the filing of a Probation or Mandatory Supervision Violation Complaint, representation by an attorney (including appointed counsel), my right to a hearing and require the prosecution to prove that I willfully violated a lawfully imposed term and condition of probation or mandatory supervision, to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against me, to produce evidence in my own defense, including using the subpoena powers of the court (without cost to me) to produce evidence and the attendance of witnesses, and to exercise my constitutional right against self-incrimination, or to remain silent. I also understand that failure to accept a recommended period of flash incarceration may result in the filing of a formal revocation petition with the court.

I do hereby freely and voluntarily agree to "flash incarceration;" and in doing so, understand and agree that I am waiving or giving up the following rights:

- To be represented by an attorney;
- To have a hearing in court and have the court determine whether the prosecution has proven that I
 willfully violated a term of my probation or supervision;
- To confront and cross-examine the witnesses against me;
- To present my own defense, and without cost to me, to use the subpoena power of the court to assist
 me in producing evidence and the attendance of witnesses in court;
- To remain silent I understand that I am waiving or giving up my right against self-incrimination; and,
- I also acknowledge that a term of "flash incarceration," up to 10 consecutive days, is not reduced by custody credits ("good time/work time").
